


Zambia & Malawi Adventure

15 nights



Brief Itinerary

Day 1	Fly Livingstone, Zambia
Day 2	Chundukwa River Lodge, 3 nights, fully-inclusive
Day 5	Fly South Luangwa, Kafunta River Lodge, 2 nights, full-board
Day 7	Kafunta Island Bush Camp, 2 nights, full-board
Day 9	Kafunta River Lodge, 1 night, full-board
Day 10	Fly Lilongwe, Danforth Lodge, 5 nights, full-board
Day 15	Fly home

Day 1

Today you will take the international flight to Livingstone, Zambia.

Day 2

On arrival in Livingstone you will be met and transferred to stay at Chundukwa River Lodge for the next 3 nights.

Livingstone is not only home to one of the incredible natural wonders of the world, the Victoria Falls, but also to a whole range of exciting adrenalin-pumping activities from bungee jumping to white water rafting and micro-lighting across the Falls. The famous Flight of the Angels in a small plane is a firm favourite, and for romantics you can have a champagne breakfast on Livingstone Island which is literally in the middle of the Falls. It is also a fun place to explore on foot, horseback or on game drives through the Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park.



Chundukwa River Lodge is 25 kms upstream from the Victoria Falls and is the perfect place to enjoy the sights and sounds of the Zambezi River, waking to the sound of hippos and watching the wildlife from your veranda. Set on the banks of the Zambezi amongst lush riverine vegetation, the unique accommodation is in five open-fronted, stilted chalets, including a family chalet and a honeymoon chalet, each with an en-suite bathroom and a private veranda with fantastic views over the river and the Zambezi National Park beyond.



You will spend 3 nights at the Chundukwa River Lodge on a full-inclusive basis.

Day 5

This morning you will fly to the South Luangwa National Park to stay at Kafunta River Lodge for the next 2 nights.

The South Luangwa National Park is one of Zambia's finest parks and one of the world's most spectacular wildlife sanctuaries. This area of outstanding beauty is also where you can enjoy some of the best walking safaris in Africa. There is a huge variety of game within the park, including large numbers of lion and leopard, and it was originally established to protect the unique and beautiful Thornicroft's Giraffe. The best way to get close to the animals and learn about the flora and fauna is undoubtedly on foot, and Kafunta combines really well with a few nights at Island Bush Camp where you can do this.



Kafunata River Lodge is a small owner-run lodge set among riverside forest on the banks of the Luangwa River, just outside and overlooking the South Luangwa National Park. It is a classically-built safari lodge, and offers all the creature comforts in a natural wildlife environment. The eight private thatched chalets are built on raised wooden platforms and have mahogany floors and walls giving a natural feel to the luxurious interiors.



You will spend 2 nights at Kafunata River Lodge on a full-board basis.

Day 7

Today you will be transferred by game drive to Kafunata Island Bush Camp

Island Bush Camp is two hours' drive south of Kafunata River Lodge, and is set in a very remote, game-rich area of the southern section of the park (although no longer pitched actually on an island as the name suggests). With grass and reed huts, and the modern comforts of hot showers and running water, it offers a rustic and very special experience. In this complete solitude far away from any other operators, you will be able to view the game on foot rather than in vehicles, though there are vehicles available if you would like to do a bit of both. It's a lovely personal camp, and a great way to explore the untouched wilderness that surrounds it.



You will spend 2 nights at Kafunata Island Bush Camp on a full-board basis.

Day 9

Today you will be transferred by game drive to Kafunata River Lodge for the night.

You will spend 1 night at Kafunata River Lodge on a full-board basis.

Day 10

Today you will fly to Lilongwe, Malawi. On arrival you will be met and be transferred to Cape Maclear on Lake Malawi to stay at Danforth Lodge for the next 5 nights.

Lake Malawi is the third largest fresh water lake in Africa and dominates the small country. It has the biggest variety of freshwater fish in the world, including some of the rarest, and it is also home to different varieties of eagle and kingfisher as well as other birdlife. With clear waters, huge sandy beaches and remote islands it's a match to the Indian Ocean, and is one of the most beautiful spots on the continent.



Danforth Lodge is on the southern shore of Lake Malawi at Cape Maclear, a beautiful peninsular surrounded almost completely by the lake, and a superb scuba diving area. The garden leads down to a clean beach and crystal clear water, and there is a small swimming pool and plenty of watersports on offer. It is relaxed and the lodge has a warm, welcoming ambience. There are four spacious, en-suite family rooms, tastefully decorated in cool, nautical colours and all opening onto a large patio. The rooms have spectacular views of the lake beyond the lawn and look out over Thumbi West Island.



You will spend 5 nights at Danforth Lodge on a full-board basis.

Day 15

Today you will be transferred to Lilongwe, where you will check in for the flight to the UK.
