


Luxury Zambia & Malawi

Brief Itinerary

Day 1	Fly Lusaka, Zambia
Day 2	Fly Lower Zambezi, Chiawa, 4 nights, fully-inclusive
Day 6	Fly South Luangwa, Chinzombo, 3 nights, fully-inclusive
Day 9	Luwi Camp, 3 nights, fully-inclusive
Day 12	Fly Likoma Island, Kaya Mawa, 5 nights, full board
Day 17	Fly home

Day 1

Today you will take the international flight to Lusaka, Zambia.

Day 2

On arrival in Lusaka you will check in for the scheduled flight to the Lower Zambezi National Park, where you will be met and transferred to stay at Chiawa for the next 4 nights.

The Lower Zambezi National Park is on the north bank of the Zambezi River, below Lake Kariba, and is one of the continent's most picturesque wilderness areas. It is an area of immense natural beauty with numerous different landscapes and lovely mature trees largely undamaged by elephant.



Chiawa is a family-run camp set in a grove of mahogany and acacia trees on the banks of the Zambezi. It has nine superior tents elevated on timber decks, which offer game viewing without even getting out of bed. They all have spectacular views of the river, luxury en-suite bathrooms and solar powered lighting. There is a spacious lounge and bar area which has an observation platform built into its roof, providing one of the best views in the valley. The dining area overlooks the river and all the animals, which regularly come to drink and feed at and near the lodge.



You will spend 4 nights at the Chiawa on a full-inclusive basis.

Day 6

This morning you will fly to the South Luangwa National Park to stay at Chinzombo for the next 3 nights.

One of Zambia's finest parks and one of the world's most spectacular wildlife sanctuaries South Luangwa National Park is an area of outstanding beauty where walking safaris are some of the best in Africa. There is a huge variety of game within the park, including large numbers of lion and leopard and it was originally established to protect the unique Thornicroft's Giraffe. The best way to get close to the animals and learn about the area is on a walking safari where you can walk to and between the bush camps.



The next generation of Zambian bush camp. Wildly luxurious, Norman Carr's Chinzombo Camp brings a new level of style, comfort and elegance to the Luangwa Valley. There are six super-luxurious villas one of which is specially designed for families with two bedrooms. All rooms have spacious living areas and each has a private pool, cooled sleeping areas, spacious bathrooms and Wi-Fi. In the shade of gigantic, ancient evergreen shade, the 60 acre riverside location teems with wildlife and offers all rooms fantastic views of the Luangwa River.




You will spend 3 nights at Chinzombo on a fully-inclusive basis.

Day 9

Today you will be transferred by game drive to Luwi Bush Camp.

Luwi Bush Camp is our idea of the perfect bush camp: simple, unobtrusive and comfortable. It is deep within the National Park with all the animal activity happening all around you. There are four thatched bamboo huts set in a beautifully shady grove of trees on the banks off the Luwi sand river. Each room is en-suite with a flush loo and hot showers. Your meals are served around a table under the trees and in the evening a myriad of stars and the noises of the African night are your company around the campfire. The main activity from Luwi Bush Camp are the walking safaris, which are done with a qualified guide and armed guard.



You will spend 3 nights at Luwi Bush Camp on a fully-inclusive basis.

Day 12

This morning you will fly to Likoma Island, Malawi. On arrival you will be met and be transferred to stay at Kaya Mawa for the next 5 nights.

Lake Malawi is the third largest fresh water lake in Africa and dominates the small country. It has the biggest variety of freshwater fish in the world, including some of the rarest, and it is also home to different varieties of eagle and kingfisher as well as other birdlife. With clear waters, huge sandy beaches and remote islands it's a match to the Indian Ocean, and is one of the most beautiful spots on the continent. Kaya Mawa is the only lodge on Likoma Island, a stunning paradise a couple of miles off the Mozambique coast. Reached by light aircraft, or (for the intrepid) by local ferry, it is a beautiful luxury hideaway, with rooms imaginatively built into the rock, and surrounded by crystal clear waters and sandy beaches.



The seven rooms and four houses are strung out along the private crescent beach, each one feeling private and unique. The rooms each have special features, whether its a large sunken baths open to the sky so you can bathe under the moon, a ladder from your deck down to the lake or a plunge pool. All the rooms are wonderful, but if you want something extra special, there are private houses with more space and their own private verandas and plunge pools, ideal for families or honeymooners. The main bar and restaurant is set on the beach, as is the 'watersports centre', and has an open deck filled with sofas where you can relax with a drink or play a game of bao. There are also swing seats dotted around the beach for quiet moments with a book.



You will spend 5 nights at Kaya Mawa on a fully-inclusive basis.

Day 17

Today you will be transferred to Likoma Island, where you will fly to Lilongwe and check in for the flight to the UK.
